Dee moved that we increase our donation to the library for this year, because of the wonderful services that they have rendered to our group, including finding a meeting space for us when one of our dates was double-booked. Show and Tell







It only seemed right to start the show and tell section with our most recent mini-project, Bali Ha'i.

From the top we have Mally's, Cathryn's and Rosie's finishes. Mally and Cathryn both did the original colorway. The progression of the variegation makes them each look a little different.

You might also note that Mally's has a different center; it looks a lot like those God's Eyes that we all used to make at summer camp! Mally achieved this by making an honest mistake while stitching the Double Fan Doubled in the center. At seminar, I have been taught several "Mistake" stitches because often they are as unique and interesting as Mally's is. (In fact, I am sure that I've been taught this one!) NJNA thinks that Mally should teach us how to make her Mistake Stitch for inclusion in our stitch notebooks!

Rosie has been trying to use stash on this year's mini-projects! This one was no exception! A different look because the variegated yellow yarn didn't change very much. My seminar roomie will attest to my impatience with shopping – that's the real reason I'm using stash! That's my story and I'm sticking to it.





This amazing Christmas stocking was designed by Diane for her Grandson. She used the above picture from a coloring book as her inspiration. After drawing the image on her canvas outline of a stocking, she picked her own colors and stitches! I am awestruck!

Sue R's ANG Chapter in Atlanta ordered these boxes as a group. They are buying their canvas designs from the Nancy's Needles website. The designs cover all holidays and special occasions and they all fit in the box. So you can change the canvas out whenever the mood hits! NJNA members are lusting after this box. Sue says you can get them on the Nancy's Needles website, but these were made for the Atlanta group by a secret friend!



This Sudberry box is a perfect fit for the design that Sue C bought when she attended the EGA seminar in Phoenix. For a few days prior to seminar, Sue and I made a tour of all the needlepoint shops in Phoenix. Old Town Needlework in Scottsdale had offered this design by Toni Gerdes at a retreat in Tucson the weekend before. We both succumbed!



Sue R found this Lee's bag on clearance at Mrs. Stitches and paired it with a poppy canvas. Lee's bags can be self-finished with sticky tape! Isn't this stunning?



Barbara L found this fun tooth fairy canvas at Rita's in NYC. It was finished by Edwardian Needle and there is even a pocket for a tooth! Barbara stitched this for her five-year old Granddaughter in California. The tooth fairy will be visiting soon, I bet!

Sue R and Sue C stitched the pig on the left as a gift for Rosie, who has a collection of pig ornaments. Sue R made the lighthouse for her daughter who just bought a house in Connecticut. The fluffy clouds are done by pulling Frosty Rays and couching it down. Both of these were finished by Nimble Needle in Atlanta.



Cathryn purchased this canvas from Needlepoint Inc. in San Francisco. They also did the finishing. You had to be at the meeting to hear the rest of the story!





During a visit to Paris, Cathryn found these two ornaments at Tapisseries. This shop encourages stitching with wool only. Cathryn thought they needed some bling, so she added beads and a ruched ribbon to the one on the left and some silk threads to the one on the right.

Both were finished by the Edwardian Needle.





Two more ornaments that were stitched by Cathryn and finished at Edwardian Needle.



Barbara L has found that Chandal Needlework in Texas has a selection of Jewish ornaments by Lee's Needle Artists. She used brick beading on this one – Barbara's first use of this beading technique. I love how the beaded tassel echoes the stripes in the star! Edwardian Needle did the finishing!



Heidi likes to buy an ornament canvas to commemorate her travel destinations. What better way to commemorate her time at the ANG National Seminar in New Orleans than with a Tabasco ornament? (Admittedly, we had some awesome (and spicy) food in New Orleans!)
